Workforce/Tort Reform

- Gov's Workforce Bill SF 2383 Sent to the Governor's Office
- Gov's Tort Reform Bill SF 2275 and HF 2279 Alive but has an uphill battle
- MH Loan Repayment Prog. HF 2549 Passed the House and amended by the Senate, Waiting for a second House vote
- Last Dollar Scholarships SF 2129 and HF 2165 Alive but has an uphill battle
- Employment Agencies HF 2521 Sent to the Governor's Office



Hospital Operations

- Pharmacy Matters SF 2088 and HF 2169 Alive but has an uphill battle
- Vol. EMS Tax Abatement SF 2375 – Alive but has an uphill battle

HHS Budget Bill (House's Version)

- Passed the House and has not moved in the Senate
- Bill Includes:
 - Medicaid increase of \$35.8 million level funding for hospital rates
 - \$2 million for tiered rates for psychiatric intensive care
 - \$800,000 for rural psychiatric residencies
 - \$1.5 million for the Cost Adjustment Factor for CAHs
 - Continuation of the Provider Tax
 - \$425,000 for the Center of Excellence Program



HHS Budget Bill (House's Version)

- HHS Bill (con't):
 - Language on state-funded psychiatry residency program
 - "Right to Try" legislation
 - Language requiring U of I College of Medicine accepts at least 75% of students from Iowa or an Iowa college
 - Language requiring UIHC offer interviews for medical residency positions to any applicant with a specialty in a designated field
 - Language on billing for telehealth by out-of-state providers
 - Language on health data privacy
- Unknown if the Senate will amend the House's bill or develop their own

Federal Update

Sustaining Hospital Operations

- Extending the Medicare sequester relief until the end of the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency or Dec. 31, 2022, whichever is later.
- Allocating additional Provider Relief Fund dollars
- Protecting the 340B drug savings program

Supporting Hospital Workforce

- Pursing visa relief for foreign-trained nurses as included in the Healthcare Workforce Resilience Act.
- Extending and expanding the Conrad State 30 J-1 visa waiver program



Federal Update

- Transitioning from the Pandemic to an Endemic
 - Ensuring certain critical 1135 waivers are made permanent
 - Making permanent certain telehealth flexibilities, including lifting geographic and originating site restrictions, expanding practitioners who can provide telehealth.
 - Extending the flexibilities allowing certain acute hospital care to be provided in a patient's home and explore creation of a permanent "hospital-at-home" program.
